CRS	<p>CROSSBOW – NEW FOR 2007 – all ages shoot together, male and female classes</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Compound or Recurve cross bows permitted • bow must be cocked by shooter • cocking aid may be used • Any type of sight permitted (no range finders) 		
M60	<p>Masters 60 M or F</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any type of equipment or style, subject to any restrictions as defined by FAC rules 11.11.2 may be used 	M50	<p>Masters 50</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any type of equipment or style, subject to any restrictions as defined by FAC rules 11.11.2 may be used
M50TR	<p>Masters Traditional</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any type of traditional Recurve or long bow • bow may be shot with glove, bare fingers or finger tab • sights not permitted • stabilizers not permitted • archer will touch the arrow with index finger against the nock • single anchor point string walking and face walking not permitted 	PW	<p>Peewee</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • This class may be established at the discretion of the host club • Any type of equipment or style, subject to any restrictions in the rules may be used • The maximum shooting distance will be 15 yards (13.72 metres) • Archers in this class are not entitled to receive medals or awards based on score but all shooters should receive participation awards • There are no separate male and female Peewee classes
CU	<p>Compound Unaided</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • compound bow with no sights • rest and plunger are permitted • no markings permitted on bow or string • archer must shoot with a glove, bare fingers or finger tab 	BHF	<p>Bow Hunter Fingers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A compound, recurve or longbow may be used • The bow must be shot with a glove, finger tab or bare fingers. • A non-electronic sight which may be moveable sight is allowed • The sight may be fixed pin, cross hair or scope style with or without a lens , which may be magnifying • Circle style pins are allowed if the circles are of one size
RU	<p>Recurve Unaided</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recurve or long bow permitted • must be shot with glove, bare fingers or finger tab • no sighting device permitted • no marks on bow or string • rest and plunger are permitted • draw checks are not permitted • arrows used must be all made of the same material, uniform length and width • no stabilizers are permitted • archer must use a single anchor point, no string walking or face walking permitted 	HUN	<p>Hunter</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A compound recurve, or longbow may be used • The bow may be shot with a release aid, a finger tab, a glove or bare fingers • If a sight is used: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A crosshair style sight will have no more than four crosshair points, • A fixed pin sight will have no more than (4) pins • A circle pin sight must have all circles of the same size • It must not have a lens whether magnifying or not\ • It may not be electronic • Arrows must have screw in style points and a minimum 4 inch vanes or feathers • Only one single stabilizer being less than 12 inches in length from the nearest point of attachment is allowed • Secondary vibration dampers that extend less than 2 inches from point of attachment are allowed. • These vibration dampeners are not

BHR	<p>Bow Hunter Release</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • compound, Recurve or long bow permitted • bow must be shot with some type of release aid • if sight is used, it must have fixed pins • cross hair style pins are permitted • sights may not be adjusted while on range during tournament 	HF	<p>Hunter Fingers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Allowed equipment is as for HUN above except that the bow may only be shot with a finger tab, a glove or bare fingers
BHO	<p>Bow Hunter Open</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Compound, Recurve or longbow are permitted • any type of release aid, glove, finger tab or bare fingers are permitted • moveable sights are permitted 	TRD	<p>Traditional Longbow</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There is a 90lb maximum bow weight • The bow must satisfy the following definition of a longbow; When the bow is strung, the string touches only the nocks of the bow, at the shelf the bow will be cut no closer than 1/8 inch to the centerline of the bow. In case a bow cut centre shot is found, it may be re-qualified by adding a leather pad to a thickness that will meet the rules. • The bow may be shot with a glove, finger tab or bare fingers • While shooting, the archer will touch the arrow with the index finger against the nock • The archer will use a single anchor point – string walking and face walking are not allowed • All arrows must be nocked at the same string location • Strings must have single colour middle serving with no marks • One or two nock locators, which may be snap – on type, tubing, thread or dental floss tied or served on the servings are allowed • The arrow must be shot from the shelf or hand with no elevated rest, Only a piece of leather or similar material 1/8 inch thick or less is allowed on the arrow shelf. • Cushion plungers or rests with mechanical adjustments are not allowed • No sights, stabilizers or counter balances are allowed. Attempts to circumvent this rule by building bows with massive or weighted handle risers will disqualify the shooter • Arrow shafts • must have a minimum of 125 grain points • must be identical in length, weight and colour; except for normal wear • must be wooden • An overdraw is not allowed
JRC	<p>Junior Compound</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • compound bow must be used • bow may be shot with release, glove, finger tab or bare fingers 	JRT	<p>Junior Traditional</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any type of Recurve or long bow • bow may be shot with glove, bare fingers or finger tab • sights not permitted • stabilizers not permitted • archer will touch the arrow with index finger against the nock
